The 2021 Premier League Netball commenced on time but.....after playing only 12 rounds, it stopped – once again because of the Covid virus. Sadly, due to the virus not being contained, the competition did not re-start in 2021. By this time, both our teams found their mojo and were beginning to perform to the level we all thought they could – so it was very sad that the competition stopped.

As mentioned in previous years, Panthers Premier League Netball do not have their own indoor courts – or the use of a court on a semi-permanent basis. However regardless of court availability, all public indoor courts were closed and training together was totally suspended. However, Coaches and our S&C coach ran zoom sessions to ensure we could come back ready to play. Once it became apparent that netball would not resume in 2021, the teams were disbanded although all coaching staff have kept in contact with players.

An end of year event was still envisaged and booked, however it was also cancelled due to Covid. So altogether a very disappointing year.
